While pronunciation is essentially the same for both “use to” and “used to”, correct spelling (when to put “**d**” after “use”) depends on the use of “**did**”.

Use “*use to*” (drop the “**d**”)

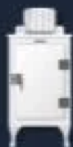
- When using “**did**” in **negative statements**:
“I **didn**’t *use to* play video games.”
- When using “**did**” in **questions**:
“**Did** you *use to* video chat on Skype?”

Remember: drop the **d** with **did**

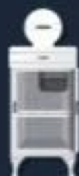
